**DAILY NATIONAL GRAIN SUMMARY**

USDA'S ANNOUNCED BREAKDOWN OF FOOD AID PACKAGE TO RUSSIA GAVE GRAIN AND BEAN PRICES SOME SUPPORT BUT WHEAT SUFFERED SLIGHTLY WITH LESS WHEAT THAN HOPED FOR INCLUDED IN AID PACKAGE. WHEAT MIXED. CORN MIXED. SORGHUM 1 TO 2 CENTS LOWER. SOYBEANS 3 TO 7 CENTS HIGHER. ALTHOUGH WHEAT WAS INCLUDED IN U.S. AID TO RUSSIA, SOME DISAPPOINTMENT WAS NOTED AS LESS THAN ORIGINALLY THOUGHT WAS PORTIONED. MODERATE SUPPORT CAME FROM DECREASED INVENTORY OF OLD CROP SOFT RED WINTER WHEAT. POTENTIAL FOR A BUMPER WINTER WHEAT CROP ADDED PRESSURE TO PRICES. KANSAS FARM BUREAU FORECAST THE KANSAS WHEAT CROP AT 481 MILLION BUSHELS TODAY, A RECORD FIGURE FOR THAT STATE. CORN PRICES FARED WELL IN THE FOOD AID BREAKDOWN BUT DRIER WEATHER FORECAST FOR MIDWEST AND LACK OF NEW EXPORT INTERESTS LIMITED GAINS IN PRICES. MODERATE INCREASES IN SOYBEAN PRICES ALSO DUE TO RELEASED AID DETAILS AND GOOD AMOUNT OF SOYBEAN INCLUDED. INDICATIONS THAT CHINA SEEKING ABOUT 30,000 TONNES U.S. SOYBEANS ALSO A PLUS FOR BEAN PRICES.

EXPORT NEWS: USDA PROVIDED DETAILS ON THE FOOD AID PACK-

AGE FOR RUSSIA: THE 300 MILLION U.S. DOLLAR COMMODITY PORTION WILL COMPRISE 433.5 MILLION IN CREDITS TO RUSSIA AND 66.5 MILLION IN DONATIONS. THE PACKAGE CONSISTS OF 227.5 MILLION DOLLARS FOR CORN; 105 MILLION FOR SOYBEAN; 66.5 MILLION FOR BUTTER; 56 FOR WHEAT (12 MILLION IN DONATIONS); 5 MILLION FOR SUGAR AND 40 MILLION FOR HIGH-VALUE PRODUCTS LIKE VEGETABLE OIL, PEANUTS, POULTRY AND RICE. SUB-SAHARAN AFRICA BOUGHT 8,000 TONNES U.S. HARD RED WINTER WHEAT UNDER BFP FOR MAY SHIPMENT. USDA ACCEPTED A BID TO SELL 5,000 TONNES SUNOIL TO MEXICO UNDER THE SUNFLOWERSEED OIL ASSISTANCE PROGRAM FOR JUNE SHIPMENT.

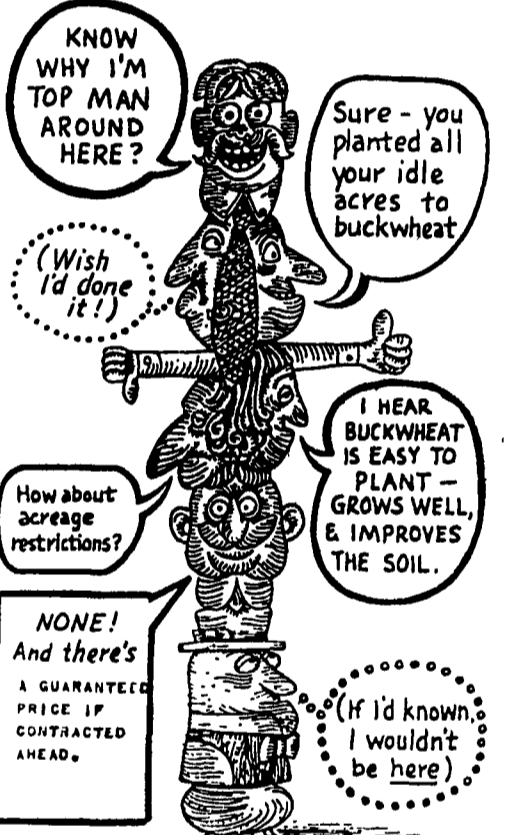

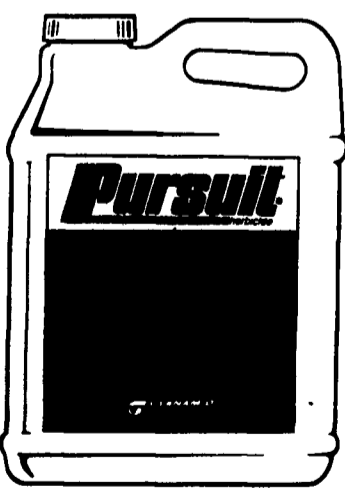


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
