





Pa. Plant Corn Acres

LEESPORT (Berks Co.) — The U.S. Department of Agriculture's prospective plantings report places Pennsylvania's 1993 com seedings at 1.36 million acres, one percent below last year.

Corn plantings for the nation are expected to total 76.5 million acres this year, four percent less than last year.

"Acres actually planted may vary from those indicated," said Richard Troutman, chairman of the Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Service (ASCS) because of the 1993 farm programs. the effects of weather, and changes in market conditions before planting.

The USDA report is based on voluntary responses from approximately 70,000 farm operators to a survey conducted the first two weeks of March. Many producers had not made their final planting decisions for the 1993 crop year at that time.


Troutman said the sign-up period for this year's farm programs ended April 30.

"Therefore, the report provides only a preliminary indication of farmers' responses to the 1993 feed grain program."

The feed grain program calls for a 10 percent reduction in corn base acres this year and offers a federal target price of \$2.75 per bushel and price support loans at \$1.72 per bushel. The seasonaverage price for corn for 1992/1993 is projected to range between \$1.95 and \$2.15 per bushel.


