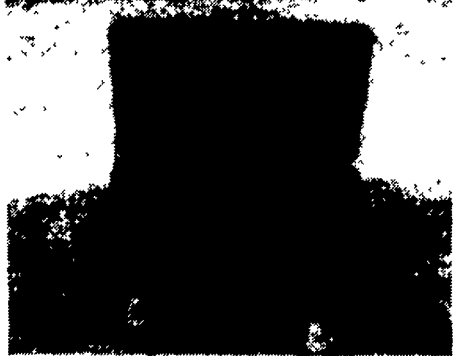

## 'Detective' Skills Can Help Troubleshoot Problems

UNIVERSITY PARK (Centre  
Co.) — At one time or another,  
most dairy herds experience a  
drop in milk production, a reduced  
milk fat test, or metabolic prob-  
lems such as milk fever, ketosis,  
or displaced abomasum.

"When many animals develop  
health problems or when produc-  
tion declines with no apparent im-  
provement, you have a serious  
problem," said Virginia Ishler,  
dairy and animal science exten-  
sion assistant in Penn State's Col-  
lege of Agricultural Sciences.  
"Before bringing in outside assis-  
tance, do some preliminary inves-  
tigating.

"Work like a detective trying to  
solve a mystery. Examine all fac-  
tors that could affect your herd's  
health or productivity, no matter  
how simple they seem."

Feed is a good place to start.  
"Monitor the moisture content of  
all wet feed items," Ishler said.  
"Changes in moisture content can  
cause cows to eat more than ex-  
pected or to not eat enough. The  
same is true for high-moisture  
concentrate ingredients."

Next, estimate dry-matter in-  
takes to determine if total feed in-  
take meets expectations. "Make  
sure a cow's dry-matter intake is  
appropriate for her weight and  
milk production level," Ishler  
said. "The period two to four  
weeks before freshening is parti-  
cularly important. Nutritional im-  
balances at this time can have a  
major impact on production and  
health in early lactation."

Analyze any ingredient changes  
in forage or feed. "Retest forages  
that have not been checked in the  
past four to eight weeks, especial-  
ly hay-crop forages," Ishler said.  
"You may need to sample grains  
and by-product feed ingredients  
for dry matter and nutrient con-  
tent."

If a herd on total mixed rations  
(TMR) develops a problem, sam-  
ple the TMR and send it to a lab  
for wet chemistry analysis, no  
matter how well it's mixed. "The  
analysis should include neutral de-  
tergent fiber, soluble protein, sul-

fur and trace minerals," Ishler  
said. "If the ration contains fat or  
oilseeds, ask the lab to test for  
crude fat."

The cost for the analysis can  
range between \$30 and \$45. "But  
it's well worth it if the test results  
reveal discrepancies between  
what you think cows are consum-  
ing and what they actually get,"  
Ishler said.

If you use conventional feed,  
analyze the grain mixes if other  
tests reveal no problems.

Wet weather during the past  
year has caused molds in dairy  
feeds. "Suspicious rations or feeds  
should be tested for mycotoxins,"  
said Ishler. "Quick tests may be  
run at feed mills, veterinary of-  
fices, or on the farm to determine  
whether feeds contain mycotox-  
ins. However, samples also should  
be sent to laboratories for quanti-  
tative tests."

Check the somatic cell counts  
(SCC) on milk-plant samples  
taken during the past several  
months and on Dairy Herd Im-  
provement Association records.  
"See if the data point to groups of  
problem cows," Ishler said. "Also  
determine the percentage of cows  
with clinical mastitis during recent  
months. Frequent flare-ups of  
clinical mastitis in the same cows  
may indicate contagious mastitis.  
A higher incidence of clinical  
mastitis in early lactation or dur-  
ing hot weather may indicate en-  
vironmental mastitis."

Check both milk-fat and protein  
percentages. "Abnormally high or  
low values or changes may indi-  
cate possible nutritional causes,"  
Ishler said. "A milk-fat test result  
more than .3 percent above or be-  
low breed average is considered  
abnormal. An abnormal milk pro-  
tein test usually is more than .2  
percent above or below breed  
average."

"If your detective work doesn't  
solve the mystery, you may need  
to seek outside assistance," Ishler  
said. "Even if this is necessary,  
your preliminary investigation  
will give a veterinarian or other  
specialist valuable information for  
making a diagnosis."
