ANSWER — Edith Vuxta, Elizabethtown, wanted a recipe for red velvet whoopie pies. Thanks to Anna Joyce Martin, East Earl, and others for sending recipes. Red Velvet Whoopie Pies

- ½ cup shortening
- 1½ cups sugar
- 2 eggs
- 2 ounces red food coloring
- 2 tablespoons baking cocoa
- 11/2 teaspoon baking soda
- 3½ cups flour
- 1 teaspoon vanilla
- 1 teaspoon sait
- cup buttermilk
- tablespoon vinegar

Make a paste of chocolate and food coloring. Set aside. Cream shortening, sugar, and eggs. Add cocoa mixture and vanilla. Beat at medium speed for several minutes. Add flour, salt, and buttermilk alternately to mixture. Beat several minutes at medium speed. Fold in baking soda and vinegar. Do not beat. Drop by tablespoonfuls on cookie sheets. Bake at 350 degrees for 12 to 15 minutes or until done.
