The association also inducted the 1993-94 officers at the banquet: Alan Yost, president; Wil-

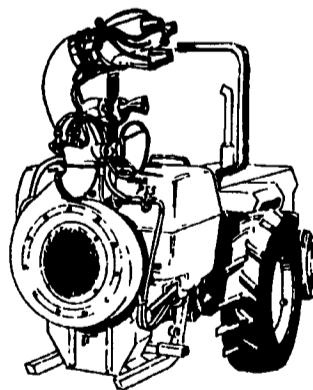
liam Rinas, vice president; Charles Richardson, secretary; Dwight Hedrick, treasurer; and Mark Hushon, director of public relations.

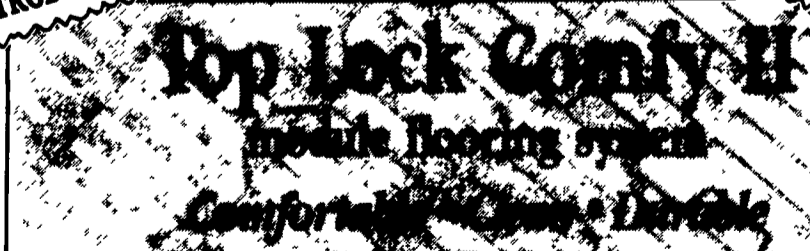

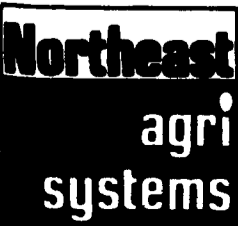
