

PACD Selects Nominees For Vacancies

HARRISBURG (Dauphin Co.) - During its executive council meeting in Wilkes-Barre on April 16. the Pennsylvania Association of Conservation Districts (PACD) selected nominees to recommend to Governor Robert P. Casey to fill two farmer vacancies on the State Conservation Commission.

Amos H. Funk, vice chairman and member of the commission for 19 years, has declined to accept reappointment when his

term expires in May; and George B. Wolff, who has served since 1980, has announed his resignation. Both men will continue to serve until the governor appoints successors.

The PACD will submit to Governor Casey the names of Ross Orner, Jr. of Clearfield County, and Dr. James S. Shadle of Schuyl-kill County. Shadle served as chairman of the Schuylkill County Conservation District for


36 years. He is a full-time farmer. Shadle was a high school vocational agriculture teacher for 18 years, an agricultural education instructor at Penn State University for two years, and has been principal of the Blue Mountain Middle School in Schuylkill County for the past 10 years.

Ross Orner, Jr. presently serves as chairman of the Clearfield County conservation district board. He operates a 580-acre family dairy farm, managing a

herd of approximately 200 cows and heifers. He is also a member of Agway, Inc., Atlantic Breeders Cooperative, Pennsylvania Dairy Herd Improvement, Pennsylvania Dairyman's Association, Pennsylvania Guernsey Association, Penn-sylvania Holstein Association, Pennsylvania Master Farmers Association, Pennsylvania Grange, Pennsylvania Vegetable Growers, Pennsylvania Farmers Association, and Unilec-Rural Electric Association.


