- 10-inch unbaked pie shell



- 1 cup milk
- 1 cup water
- 1 cup cornmeal
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 2 eggs, separated
- 2 tablespoons baking powder
- 1 tablespoon butter

Place milk and water in saucepan. Add cornmeal and salt. Cook 5 minutes. Add beaten egg yolks, baking powder, butter, and stiffly beaten egg whites. Pour into greased casserole and bake in 425 degree oven for 40 minutes. Serves 6.

- Pastry for 2-crust pie
- 4 cups thinly sliced green tomatoes 1¼ cups sugar
- 1/2 teaspoon cinnamon
- ½ teaspoon nutmeg
- % teaspoon salt
- 4-5 tablespoons flour
- 2 tablespoons lemon juice
- Raisins, as desired

To peel tomatoes easily, immerse in boiling water until skins slip off easily, about 3 minutes. Blend together sugar, cinnamon, nutmeg, salt, flour, lemon juice, and raisins. Toss with green tomatoes. Place in pastry-lined 9-inch pie pan. Adjust top crust and flute edges, cut vents. Bake in 425-degree oven until tomatoes are soft and crust is lightly browned, about 50 to 60 minutes.
