DAILY NATIONAL GRAIN SUMMARY WHEAT PRICES CONTINUED TO CLIMB, WEDNESDAY, SUPPORTED BY CROP CONCERNS AND EXPORT DEMAND. CORN PRICES WERE PRESSURED BY PLANTING OPTIMISM AND TECHNICAL SELLING ON THE BOARD. SHARP DECLINES IN BEAN PRICES REFLECTED WEAKNESS IN CORN PRICES, HOPES FOR ACTIVE PLANTING, AND CONCERNS FOR POSSIBLE INCREASE IN BEAN PLANTING. WHEAT UNCHANGED TO 3 CENTS HIGHER. CORN 3 TO 4 CENTS LOWER. SORGHUM 5 TO 6 CENTS LOWER. SOYBEANS 3 TO 7 CENTS LOWER. GOOD EXPORT INTEREST AND HOPES FOR RENEWAL OF CHINA'S MOST FAVORED-NATION TRADE STATUS, PUSHED WHEAT PRICES HIGHER. CONTINUED CONCERNS OVER SLOW WINTER WHEAT DEVELOPMENT AND POSSIBILITY FOR DISEASE, IF WET WEATHER CONTINUES, ADDED SUPPORT. CORN PRICES SLIPPED ON IDEAS WEATHER CONDITIONS WILL IMPROVE AND PLANTING WILL CONTINUE AT A RAPID PACE. LIGHT EXPORT DEMAND LIMITED PRICE DECLINES. SPILLOVER WEAKNESS IN CORN PITS WEIGHED ON BEAN PRICES. RECENT SHARP GAINS IN SOYBEAN AND SOYBEAN MEAL PRICES SEEN AS OVERDONE ALSO PRESSURED PRICES. POSSIBILITY FOR INCREASED BEAN PLANTING IN PLACE OF CORN STILL EXISTS.
