rnest Lawrence Thayer was paid five dollars for his final column in the San Francisco Examiner "Casey" appeared Lunder the pen name "Phin" in the Sunday edition, June 3, 1888, and no one, least of all Thayer, ever dreamt that it would be remembered and recited more than a hundred years later. The ballad did not create a stir until later that summer when comedian William DeWolf Hopper

recited it at Wallach's Theater in New York. The New York Times reported that the "thrilling ode . . . was most uproariously received." Newspapers and magazines reprinted it, and vaudevillians brought down the house across the country.

These brown-paper products create a demand for low-grade waste (such as newspapers, cardboard, and phone books) that otherwise often go from the recycling center to the landfill simply because paper companies won't buy them.


