The side panel will feature nutrition information telling consumers about the benefits of drinking milk for good health and strong bones. All retailers will be provided with artwork for side panels for their store brand milk.

To further extend retailer participation and increase consumer awareness, ADADC has developed an ad manager contest. encouraging the use of June Dairy Month milk artwork in retail ads that appear in newspapers during June.

ADADC expects to increase the sales of milk and increase consumers' awareness of their need for milk, through this campaign.

Consumers have a "real" choice when it comes to buying dairy foods. The full family of milks whole, 2 percent, 1 percent, skim and chocolate - are available in the

dairy case in half-pints, quarts, half-gallons and gallons providing consumers a wide variety nutritious beverages.

Milk is not the only dairy product promoted heavily during June. Consumers will also be encouraged to use two kinds of cheese on burgers cooked on the grill during the summer months.

The June Dairy Month promotion will be supplemented with an ice cream and toppings promotion in July making it an exciting summer for dairy promotion.


