

Live supplies were moderate; weights were in a full range, but desirable overall. Processing schedules were heavy. Less than trucklot asking prices were unchanged at 52 to 63 cents. Trade sentiment was fully steady. Some plants reported mixed and irregular orders from the New York metropolitan area where a major strike at the retail level was tentatively settled. In the part complex, leg items and wings were in fairly good balance. Breast items were available.
