DAILY NATIONAL GRAIN SUMMARY: WHEAT PRICES CONTINUED LOWER, WEDNESDAY, ON VERY GOOD CROP CONDITION, LACK OF EXPORT DEMAND, AND DELAYS IN EEP TARGET ANNOUNCEMENT. CORN PRICES SLIGHTLY LOWER DUE TO WEATHER OUTLOOK, ACTIVE PLANTING AND SMALLER WEEKLY EXPORT INSPECTION FIGURES. SOYBEANS PRICES SLIGHTLY FIRMER ON GOOD WEEKLY EXPORT INSPECTION NUMBERS. WHEAT UNCHANGED TO 3 CENTS LOWER. CORN MIXED. SORGHUM UNCHANGED TO 1 CENT LOWER. SOYBEANS MIXED. STILL NO EXPORT WHEAT ORDERS THIS WEEK WITH CHINA AND RUSSIA ALSO ABSENT. TARGETING FOR NEW EXPORT ENHANCEMENT PROGRAM HAS NOT BEEN ANNOUNCED, ADDING WEAKNESS TO PRICES. LOWER PRICES ALSO A REACTION TO USDA'S RATING OF 73 PERCENT GOOD TO EXCELLENT CONDITION AND POSSIBILITY FOR BUMPER WINTER WHEAT CROP THIS YEAR. HARVEST GRADUALLY GAINING MOMENTUM BUT MUCH BEHIND NORMAL. CORN PRICES WERE MIXED WITH PRESSURE DUE TO LACK OF EXPORT INTEREST AND SMALLER THAN EXPECTED EXPORT INSPECTION FIGURES. PLANTING PROGRESS IS ESTIMATED AT 87 PERCENT COMPLETE AND MILD WEATHER FORECAST FOR MIDWEST THIS SUMMER ALSO FACTORS FOR LOWER PRICES. SCATTERED RAINFALL STILL IN MANY AREAS OF CORN BELT AND PLANTING A PROBLEM IN PLACES. THE JUNE 1 DEADLINE HAS PASSED AND SOME PRODUCERS ESTABLISH SWITCHING FROM CORN TO BEANS AND CONTINUED WET FIELDS PLACES, WEIGHED ON SOYBEAN PRICES. SOYBEAN MEAL PRICES,

HOWEVER, ENJOYED ACTIVE BOARD BUYING, PUSHING MEAL PRICES UPWARD. THE WEEKLY INSPECTED FOR EXPORT FIGURES WERE SEEN AS POSITIVE AT 13.46 MILLION BUSHELS, UNDERPINNED PRICES AFTER TUESDAY'S PLUNGE.
