Students Selected to Participate in German Exchange Program

Fourteen FFA members have been selected to spend one year in Germany on the 1993-1994 Congress-Bundestag Youth Exchange Program.

Participants will gain a better understanding of German economics, culture and agriculture, while developing their intellectual and professional capabilities in an international environment.

Finalists received notice of their acceptance into the program after their applications were judged to be the best in the nation based on their agricultural experience, FFA activities, school and community involvement, leadership skills and carcer plans.

Prior to their departure for Germany, the group will attend a fourday orientation at the National FFA Center in Alexandria, Va. Since the development and enhancement of America's agricultural system is linked to the systems of other nations, an understanding of global agriculture is critical to the industry's future success. Consequently, students of agriculture must learn as much as possible about the agricultural, political, economic and cultural structures of other nations. In order to strengthen their awareness of the U.S. position on current agricultural issues, students will attend briefings at the U.S. Department of Agriculture and the U.S. Information Agency and meet with their congressional representatives. They will also receive specialized training in cross-cultural communication and adaptation.

Following a two-month language course in Radolfzell, Germany, each student will live with a German host family, assist with farm management and attend an agricultural secondary school.

The Congress-Bundestag program is an official youth exchange sponsored by the governments of the United States and Germany and is designed to strengthen tues between young people in each country. The program is funded through a grant from the United States Information Agency.

The National FFA Organization (FFA) cooperates with the Carl Duisberg Gesellschaft (CDG) in Germany to organize the agricultural component of the Congress Bundestag exchange. It is one of many programs FFA offers to provide premier leadership, personal growth and career development opportunities to young people in agricultural education. In 1993-1994, FFA and CDG will send 14 American students to Germany and bring 14 German students to the United States. This is the tenth year of the Congress-Bundestag Youth Exchange program.
