GASES AND ASH

June 11 marks the second anniversary of the eruption of Mount Pinatubo in the Philippines. This violent explosion spewed gases and ash that could be seen for 60 miles. Scientists have recently confirmed that a global haze from the eruption has reflected enough sunlight to cause a 1 F drop in the overall temperature of the Earth. The eruption further wreaked havoc on the weather by altering patterns of atmospheric circulation so the indirect affect of Mount Pinatubo is far greater than just one degree of cooling. Scientists say the volcanic haze is steadily dissipating and they expect the climate to recover to its pre eruption state by early 1994.

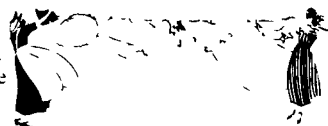

PEAR BRADF

- 1/2 cup sugar
- 4 tablespoons butter, melted
- 1 egg
- 1 cup crushed pears
- 2 cups flour
- 1 teaspoon baking soda
- 1/2 teaspoon salt

Beat together the sugar, butter, egg, and fruit. Combine dry ingredients and beat in. Pour batter into buttered 7x4-inch loaf pan. Let rest for 20 minutes so top won't crack when cooked. Bake at 375° F for 50 to 60 minutes.

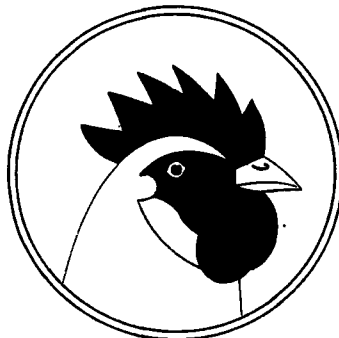

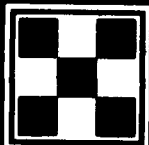
