## Brown Rot Diseases Meet Their Match

GREENSBORO, N.C. — Stone fruit growers may feel like they've "gone in circles" in recent years in their efforts to get effective control of brown rot diseases such as blossom blight and fruit rot.

Orbit®, a new stone fruit fungicide from Ciba Plant Protection, promises effective control along with several other benefits.

"These diseases have been very costly to stone fruit growers," said Dr. Eric Kuhn, Ciba product manager. "Orbit provides an effective, reliable option... consistent control at a lower cost than other available programs." Kuhn said that research proves the fungicide is a superior preventive product, and it's systemic so it doesn't wash off in rain or irrigation.

"Growers have other fungicide tools to work with, but some are limited when we get a severe outbreak of these brown rot diseases," said Dr. Eldon Zehr, plant pathologist at Clemson (S.C.) University. He said Orbit has provided exceptional control, especially in his studies when disease pressure is severe.

At the University of Georgia, Plant Pathologist Dr. Floyd Hendrix created extreme disease conditions, and Orbit significantly reduced fruit loss when compared with other available products.

Kuhn said Orbit can be applied as both

bloom and preharvest sprays. "Two four-ounce-per-acre applications are recommended to control blossom blight," he said. "A third application at petal fall is an option when disease conditions persist or the blossom season is prolonged."

He says the timing of the federal label for Orbit means most growers will only be able to use it for fruit rot con-

trol this season. The label allows two pre-harvest sprays, four ounces each. The first preharvest spray should be applied two to three weeks prior to harvest.

Kuhn said the compound works well in combination or rotation with other available fungicides. And Orbit

can be part of a planned resistance management program with other fungicide chemistries.

The product is not labeled for use on prunes east of the Rocky Mountains or on cherries anywhere in the United States. Packer line applications are not allowed.
