FAVORABLE WEATHER FOR CROP PRODUCTION AND LACK OF EXPORT ORDERS HANGING OVER THE GRAIN AND SOYBEAN MARKETS THIS WEEK. CROP PRO-DUCTION FIGURES TO BE RELEASED THURSDAY. SUBSTAN-TIAL VOLUME OF WHEAT EXPORT BUSINESS IN THE TALKING STAGE, BUT NOTHING DEFINITE. WHEAT NEEDING HELP. 


