DAILY NATIONAL GRAIN SUMMARY MOSTLY MINOR ADJUSTMENTS IN BIDS FOR GRAINS WEDNESDAY, BUT SOYBEANS POSTED SUBSTANTIAL HIGHER DUTY. WHEAT CONTINUED VERY UNEVEN 1 CENT LOWER TO 3 CENTS HIGHER. CORN STEADY TO 2 CENTS LOWER. SORGHUM 1 TO CENTS LOWER. SOYBEANS 4 TO 5 CENTS HIGHER. FAVORABLE WEATHER FOR CROP PRODUCTION AND LACK OF EXPORT ORDERS HANGING OVER THE GRAIN AND SOYBEAN MARKETS THIS WEEK. CROP PRODUCTION FIGURES TO BE RELEASED THURSDAY. SUBSTANTIAL VOLUME OF WHEAT EXPORT BUSINESS IN THE TALKING STAGE, BUT NOTHING DEFINITE. WHEAT NEEDING HELP. PRICES CURRENTLY AROUND 20 PERCENT BELOW A YEAR AGO AND HARVEST PRESSURE NOT YET IN FULL FORCE.

EXPORT NEWS: JAPAN BOUGHT A TOTAL OF 73,641 TONNES OF WHEAT IN A TENDER FOR AUGUST SHIPMENT, INCLUDING 35,547 TONNES OF DARK NORTHERN SPRING AND 19,047 TONNES OF HARD RED WINTER WHEAT. SUB-SAHARAN AFRICAN COUNTRIES PURCHASED 12,896 TONNES OF HARD RED WINTER WHEAT, UNDER THE EXPORT ENHANCEMENT PROGRAM, FOR

JUNE/JULY SHIPMENT. U.S.D.A. COMMODITY CREDIT CORP PURCHASED 5,000 TONNES OF U.S. HARD RED WINTER WHEAT AND NORTHERN/DARK NORTHERN SPRING WHEAT FOR DONATION TO GUYANA, SHIPMENT FIRST HALF JULY. LITHUANIA BOUGHT ABOUT 11,135 TONNES OF U.S. SOYMEAL UNDER PL480 TITLE I FINANCING, LATE LAST WEEK FOR JUL/AUG SHIPMENT. U.S.D.A. ACCEPTED BIDS TO SELL 2,400 TONNES OF SUNOIL TO MEXICO UNDER THE SUNFLOWERSEED OIL ASSISTANCE PROGRAM, SHIPMENT SCHEDULED FOR JUN/OCT.

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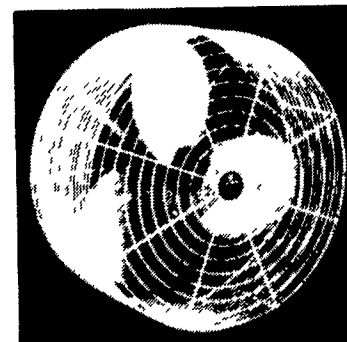


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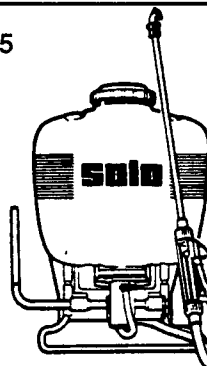
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
