TIMONIUM, Md. --- Bill Wilson, Cloverdale, Indiana, judged the 191 entries at the 1993 Atlantic National Roll of Victory (ROV) Angus Show here.

Cattle from throughout the eastern and midwestern United States competed for honors and ROV points at the event held at the Maryland State Fairgrounds on Memorial Day weekend.

B&M Roper 091 was named the show's supreme champion entry. He first won grand champion laurels in the bull show after topping the junior division. The February 1991 bull is a son of Leachman Prompter and is jointly owned by Buckner and Jeffries, Canmer, Kentucky; Forsythe Cattle Company, Marshall, Illinois; and GN and NSA Werthein, Buenos Aires, Argentina.

The reserve grand champion bull was WK T Bone owned by Whitestone Krebs, Gordon, Nebraska, and Middlefield Farms. Fort Collins, Colorado. First named the late spring calf champion, the bull is a March 1992 son of Da Es Ro Casey 629.

Corn Hybrids May Be Profitable

UNIVERSITY PARK (Centre Co.) -Farmers in some parts of Pennsylvania may be able to plant higheryielding, longer-season corn hybrids where shorter-season hybrids typically have been recommended.

"Hybrids tested in the Midwest and other parts of the country perform differently in the East," said Dr. Greg Roth of the Pennsylvania State University Agronomy Department. Roth is in the second year of a two-year study to determine the viability of planting longer-season hybrids in parts of Pennsylvania.


The difference in hybrid behavior is the number of growing degree days (GDDs) required by the plant to mature. "We've found that hybrids planted in certain areas of Per nsylvania require far fewer GDDs to mature than is commonly thought," Roth said. Joe Mayer, agronomy manager for Pioneer Hi-Bred International, Inc., in Mount Joy, said companies may be too conservative in hybrid recommendations for the northern valleys οf Pennsylvania. "If we can successfully grow longerseason hybrids and still have them mature and dry down before fall frost occurs, then corn growers in these areas may be able to get higher yields with no greater risks in production," Mayer said.

Roth noted that many Pennsylvania farmers raise a lot of highmoisture corn to feed their own livestock, and longer-season hybrids can give them greater yield potential.

"However, grain growers producing corn to be shelled and dried may not want to push hybrid maturity and take these risks," Roth said. "The downside to producing longerseason corn for grain is that the test weight often is lower than desired." Roth's study, sup-

ported in part by a grant from Pioneer HI-Bred, seeks to determine the importance of GDD ratings for hybrid selection different i n environments.

Pioneer H1-Bred administers grants for agronomic research through its North American Seed Division. In 1993, grants were given for eight new research projects and 23 continuing projects at universities nationwide
