

ANIMAL HOUSING EXPO!

Mark July 13 and 14 on your calendar now, as a reminder to attend Penn State's Animal Housing Expo at the Lebanon Fairgrounds. If you are a producer of pork, poultry, beef, or dairy products, a trip to this showcase of animal housing ideas, products, and tips may provide the direction you need in planning for building, expansion, or remodeling on your farm operation.

The show will feature nearly 40 commercial exhibitors, expert speakers, educational displays, demonstrations, and new products. The expo will focus on proven, state-of-the-art housing systems, ventilation methods, safe animal handling, environmental concerns, and production efficiency.

Of particular interest to cattle and swine producers will be the talk, "Successful Animal Handling Techniques" by Dr. Temple Grandin on July 13. Grandin, assistant professor in the animal science department at Colorado State University, also owns Grandin Livestock Handling Systems. As an independent livestock handling consultant, she has designed facilities and equipment for cattle, hogs, sheep, and horses in 30 states and 11 countries. At the expo she will also demonstrate efficient swine handling.




Dairy farmers searching for angles of efficiency should hear Oregon State University's Mike Gamroth when he presents "Getting the Most from Your Milking Parlor" on both days of the expo. Gamroth, a dairy extension specialist, is an expert in milking parlor design and management.

Each day's speaker schedule concludes with breakout sessions for dairy, poultry, and swine producers. These will be panels of farmers discussing their own experiences in building and remodeling facilities. Open from 9 a.m. - 4 p.m. each day will be displays and demonstrations, some with live animals, which will include a mini poultry composter, a "superhutch" calf facility, flooring types, freestall designs, pit ventilation, swine handling, vacuum checks, fly control, water quality, and farm safety.
