Wednesday, June 23, 1993

Movement of ready-to-cook whole birds was slow. Seller offerings were readily available and difficult to place. Live supplies were moderate; weights were mixed in a full range of light to heavy. Processing schedules remained heavy. Less than trucklot asking prices were unchanged at 52 to 63 cents; however, several plants were willing to negotiate at lower levels to clear on hand supplies. Trade sentiment was barely steady to weak. In the part complex, supplies were generally adequate for the light and selective demand. Most plants were fairly confident of increased late week movement, particularly on leg quarters.

dark meat items were more than adequate for the light demand. Even wings were slow to clear the marketplace this morning.

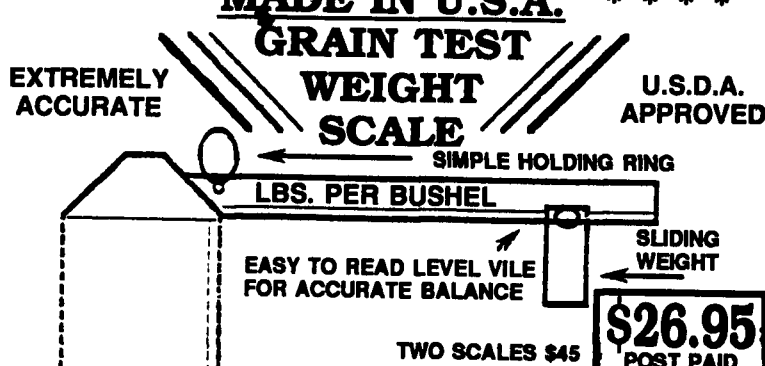
