Beef Council Elects New Board

HARRISBURG (Dauphin Co.) — Elrose Glick, a Mifflin County dairy producer, has been elected chairman of the Pennsylvania Beef Council (PBC) board of directors. Glick replaces Dennis Byrne, a beef producer from Chester County, whose term expired.

Glick, a member of the Beef Council's board of directors since 1988, has previously served as the council's first and second vice-chairman. He is a member of the Pennsylvania Cattlemen's Association and a past executive committee member of the Pennsylvania Farmer's Association.

The board of directors elected Wayne Hoffman, a cattle feeder from York County, as first vice chairman, and Dennis Snyder, a veal producer from Tioga County, as second vice chairman. 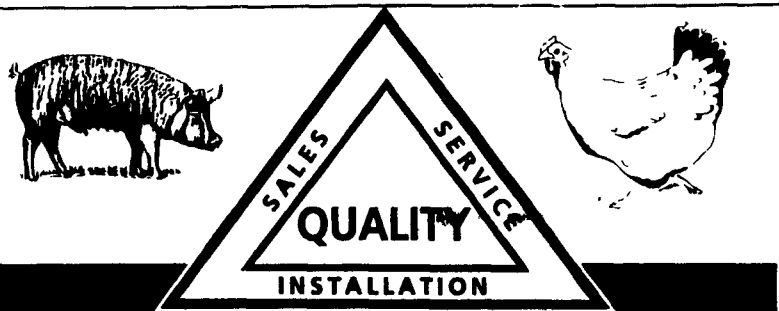
Three new directors were elected to three-year terms on the council: Bob Gabel was re-elected



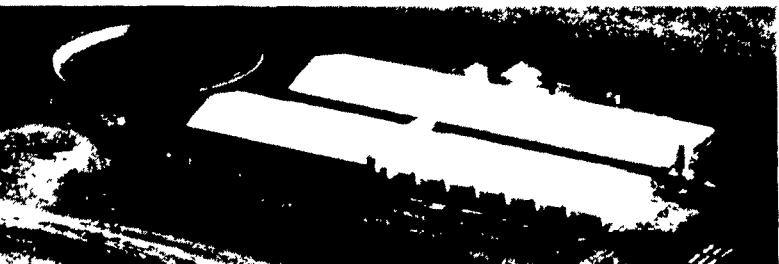

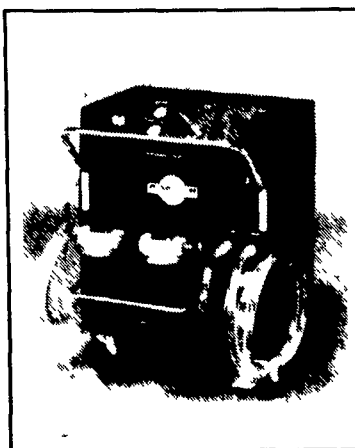
