**\*\*CORRECTION ON SOUTHERN IOWA CORN AND BEANS PRICES LESS PROTECTION TAKEN DAILY NATIONAL GRAIN SUMMARY OVERFLOWING RIVER WASHED UP HIGHER PRICES. WHEAT 2 TO 14 CENTS HIGHER. CORN 5 TO 10 CENTS HIGHER. SORGHUM 9 TO 13 CENTS HIGHER. SOYBEANS 16 TO 20 CENTS HIGHER. FLOOD WATERS COVERING THOUSANDS OF ACRES OF PRIME BOTTOM LAND ALONG THE MISSISSIPPI RIVER, ITS TRIBUTARIES AND BACKING UP INTO SMALLER RIVERS AND STREAMS TAKING A LOT OF LAND OUT OF PRODUCTION. THIS INCLUDES SOME OF THE BEST CORN GROUND IN THE COUNTRY. PLANTING DELAYS IN MANY PLACES ORIGINALLY WOULD HAVE BEEN CORN NOW GETTING TOO LATE FOR BEANS. TOO MUCH RAIN CONTINUES TO DELAY WHEAT HARVEST AND FURTHER DETERIORATES QUALITY AND YIELDS. THESE SAME SWOLLEN RIVERS NOT SAFE FOR TRANSPORTING GRAINS TO MARKETS, ESPECIALLY GULF EXPORT. MANY STATES ALREADY ASKING FOR DISASTER RELIEF AND THE SITUATION IS CRITICAL ENOUGH THAT SECRETARY OF AGRICULTURE IS SURVEYING THE DAMAGES. USDA'S GRAIN STOCKS REPORT, RELEASED THIS AFTERNOON SHOWED OLD CROP ALL WHEAT STOCKS IN ALL POSITION JUNE 1, 1993, AT 529 MILLION BUSHEL, UP 12 PERCENT FROM A YEAR AGO. CORN STORED IN ALL POSITIONS ON JUNE 1, 1993, IS ESTIMATED AT 3.71 BILLION BUSHEL, UP 35 PERCENT FROM JUNE 1, 1992.**

**SOYBEANS ARE ESTIMATED AT 683 MILLION BUSHEL, DOWN 2 PERCENT BELOW HOLDINGS A YEAR AGO.**

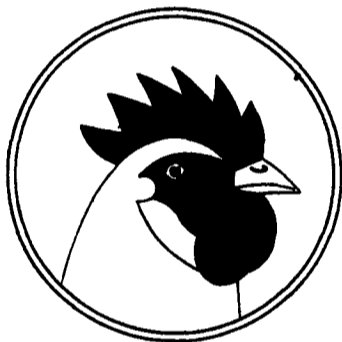

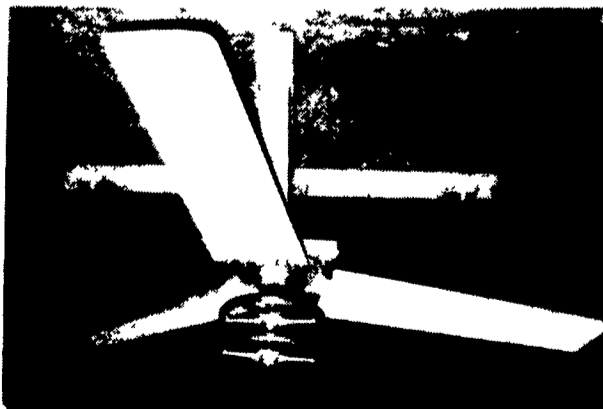

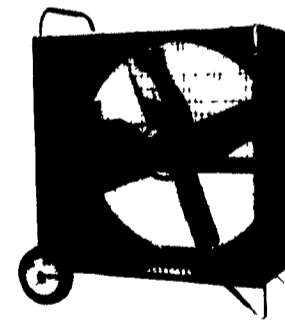
