to the Guernsey breed.

The late John Merryman managed and auctioned Guernsey sales for 45 years in 38 states and Canada. He managed nearly every major Guernsey sale in North America and Canada during his long career. By 1977, he had auctioned off 62 of the 66 Guernsey bulls that sold for \$10,000 or more. What's more, 86 of the 94 highest-priced Guernseys ever sold were auctioned under his gavel.

Merryman owned some of the finest Guernseys available at that time. Among them was Willow Brook Dena, who at one time held the milk production record for the Guernsey breed. Another was Cleverlands Darimost Chrystal, the highest-scored cow of the breed at that time. Another cow the accomplished cattle enthusiast owned at one time was MD Maple Lawn Maquis Glamour, the dam of Allendairy Glamorous Ivy, the first cow ever sold for one million dollars.

Merryman owned and operated a 500-acre property near Sparks, known as "The Orebanks. He was a former director of the Maryland State Fair, a trustee of the Maryland 4-H Foundation, and Director of the Maryland Guernsey Breeders' Association. In 1991, he was proclaimed the Baltimore County Agriculture Man of the Year. Merryman is survived by his wife

Katherine, six children, six grandchildren, a sister and a brother.

Winters Named Master Breeder

Kenneth J. Winters of Mabton, Washington, was named Master Breeder.

Winters has many credentials in his favor earning him the title of Master Breeder. From 1974 to 1991 he was the owner, breeder and manager of Win Crest Guernsey Dairy in Mabton, Washington. He bred over 60 excellent Guernsey cows, including several of the highest-scored animals in the breed! His breeding practices included production as well as type. He bred production leaders and gold star cows, as well as national show winners and All-Americans. He was also well-known for his merchandising abilities when he hosted the Win Crest sales. Through these, he demonstrated that top dollars should be spent for top genetics.

Winters got his start in the Guernsey business as far back as 1950 when he purchased a Chicoma Norwyn daughter, Bonneville Vidalia, for \$150. "Vidalia" had three daughters and Wincrest Knights Vel, the first 96 point cow in the breed, is a direct descendent from her. Winters was the breeder of four national grand champions, as well as breeding three of the sires of these champions. Three of these four national grand champions went on to produce national

class leading records!

Winters has earned the respect of many key leaders in the dairy industry. Doug Wilson, chief executive officer for 21st Century Genetics, said that Ken Winters is a master breeder. He said, "Seldom can anyone look back on a career in cattle breeding and have household names like "Vel" as a part of their contribution. Seldom can people be one of the most talked about breeders of cows in a national show and not even be there! Seldom can people say the name of an individual and everyone across the country instantly respond with, "He bred some of the best!"

John and Bonnie Ayars, prominent Guernsey breeders from Mechanicsburg, Ohio, also speak highly of Winters. They said, "When it comes to the art of breeding good Guernsey cows, very few of us will achieve the level of success that Mr. Ken Winters has mastered. Since a portion of his legacy, Win Crest Vayette Grace, stands in our barn, we feel he is well deserving of this Master Breeder honor. The Win Crest herd may no longer be in business, but the impact on our breed has been positive and progressive. The legacy continues in his prefix and it is most fitting to honor Mr. Ken Winters with Master Breeder."

tion will be at the Radisson in Burlington, Vermont, June 24-27, 1994.

Children may participate in games, train rides, and covered

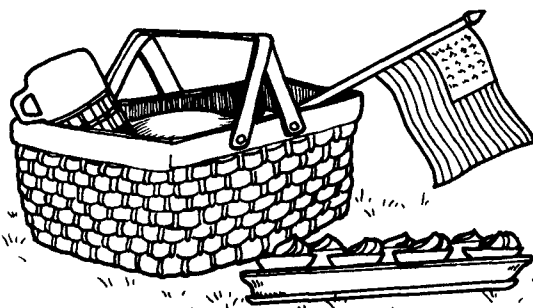
wagon rides.
