NATIONAL EGG MARKET - AT A GLANCE: Prices were unchanged to lower in the Northeast, unchanged elsewhere around the country. The trade sentiment ranged steady to weak, mostly cautiously steady. Movement of cartoned eggs was light to instances fairly good, mostly fair. Supplies were irregularly distributed, mostly adequate or available. Breaking stock prices in the Central States region were unchanged. Trading and demand were limited. Offerings were fully adequate. Most breaking firms await further market developments. The undertone was barely steady. In the Southeast, trading in hens was too light to establish values. Most processors operated desired schedules. Demand was moderate. Buyers watch weather conditions closely.
