All that being said, I want to assure you that the Senate Democratic Caucus has set a course and is determined to help make Pennsylvania more economically viable.

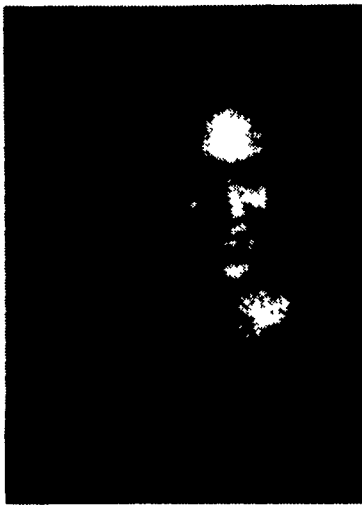

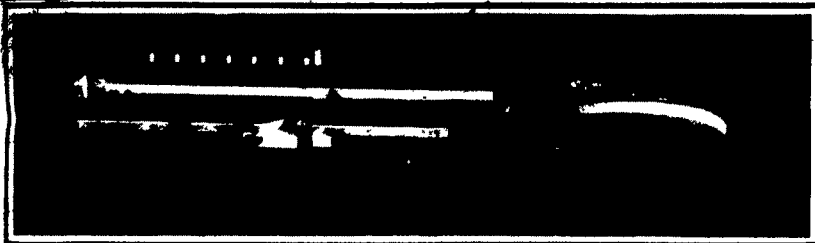
Originally from a dairy farm in northeastern Pennsylvania, Green resides in Fayetteville, N.Y.

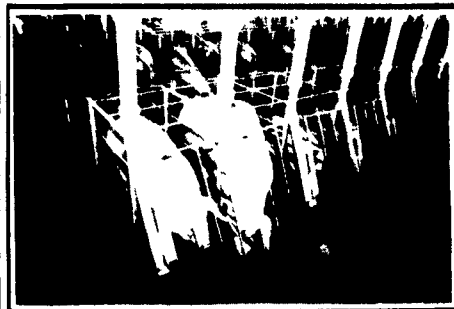

All this has been achieved by a unique gravity fliprail that forces sows to lie down slowly and using stainless steel for rear doors and legs, proven horizontal and solid steel rod construction. All this at a reasonable cost. Crate also can be installed on an angle.



FINISHING PENNING

Optional stainless steel verticals and fasteners offer improved durability over other similar types of penning. Loop and flapper latch arrangement eliminates the use of drop pins. Stainless steel fence line feeders provide excellent durability and a minimum of waste.



NURSERY PENNING
