## USDA Announces Penn State Grants

UNIVERSITY PARK (Centre Co.) — Officials from the U.S. Department of Agriculture traveled to Penn State's University Park Campus recently to announce the 1993 challenge and fellowship grants awarded by the USDA Office of Higher Education programs.

The announcement came during the National Association of State Universities and Land-Grant Colleges Academic Programs Section (APS) summer work conference, held July 11-14 and hosted by Penn State's College of Agricultural Sciences. The conference unites the deans of land-grant colleges of agriculture to discuss academic issues and share information about new educational programs.

"It's an honor to have this announcement made at Penn State," said Dr. James Mortensen, associate dean for resident educa-

tion in the university's College of Agricultural Sciences and chair of the APS summer work conference.

On behalf of Secretary of Agriculture Mike Epsy, Dr. W. Jay Jackman, grants program specialist, and Dr. Jeffrey Gilmore, grants program manager for USDA, announced the recipients of 31 Food and Agricultural Sciences National Needs Graduate Fellowships Program grants and 23 Higher Education Challenge Program grants.

Penn State's College of Agricultural Sciences received a National Needs Graduate Fellowships Program grant. The award will support two graduate fellows working with Dr. Hector Flores, associate professor of plant pathology, on plant biotechnology projects.

Previous National Needs Gra-


duate Fellowships grants to Penn State researchers have supported 11 doctoral and 6 master's degree students.

Since 1984, the Food and Agricultural Sciences National Needs Graduate Fellowships Program has encouraged outstanding students to pursue graduate degrees in critical areas of food and agricultural science.

The effort has supported the graduate programs of more than 650 students nationwide in areas such as plant and animal biotechnology, human nutrition, agricultural marketing and management, water science, and agricultural engineering.

To date, 96 projects have been supported by the program, including a 1990 Penn State project to develop an introductory food science course for nationwide satellite distribution.




