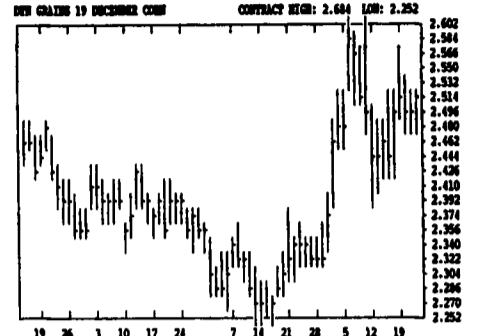
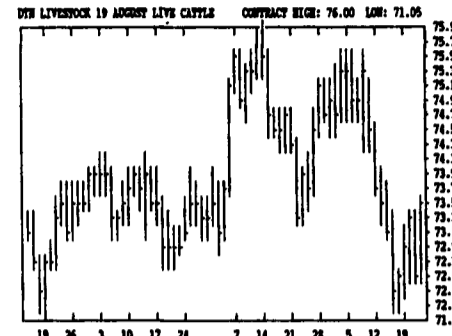
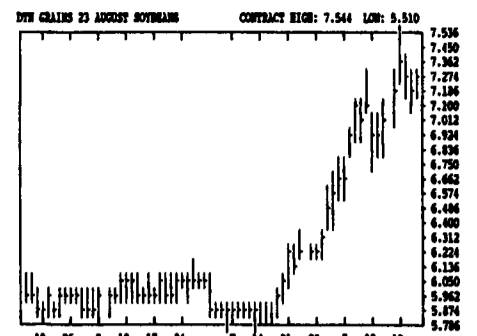

## Pork Quality Assurance Topic Of Meeting

LANCASTER (Lancaster Co.) — Information about the Pork Quality Assurance (PQA) program will be available to producers after a dinner of pork barbecue on Monday, August 30 at 12:30 p.m. at the Farm and Home Center.

The PQA program was begun in 1989 by the National Pork Producer Council (NPPC) as a way for U.S. pork producers to address their role in providing a safe, wholesome product to consumers. The PQA program emphasizes good management practices in the handling and use of animal health products and encourages produc-

ers to evaluate their herd's health program on a yearly basis.

PQA is a three-level program which includes an overview of how the producer can use quality assurance on the farm, a self-review of information in the first level, and verification upon completion of the three levels.
