WHEAT PRICES CONTINUED TO RISE WITH THE FLOOD WATERS ASSISTED BY VERY GOOD EXPORT ORDERS AND RAIN DELAYED HARVEST; CORN AND SOYBEAN PRICES DECLINED ON HOPES FOR CHANGE IN RAINY FORECASTS. WHEAT 1 TO 4 CENTS HIGHER. CORN 1 TO 3 CENTS LOWER. SORGHUM 1 TO 2 CENTS LOWER. SOYBEANS 7 TO 11 CENTS LOWER. RAINS IN KANSAS AND NEBRASKA CONTINUED TO SLOW WHEAT HARVEST AND CONCERN OVER QUALITY OF UNHARVESTED WHEAT GROWING. EXPORT DEMAND VERY GOOD FOR WHEAT THIS WEEK. CORN AND SOYBEAN PRICES FELL ON SOME REPORTS CALLING FOR LESS RAIN THAN EARLIER PREDICTED. LIGHT EXPORT DEMAND FOR BEANS LIMITED PRICE DECLINES. REPORTS SOME SALES OF SOYBEANS FOR

LATE SUMMER SHIPMENT MIGHT BE SWITCHED TO BRAZIL DUE TO LACK OF BARGE MOVEMENT ALONG THE MISSISSIPPI RIVER SYSTEM, ADDED TO PRICE WEAKNESS.

NATIONAL EGG MARKET - AT A GLANCE:

Prices trended higher for all sizes in most market reporting areas. The trade sentiment ranged steady to firm, mostly fully steady to firm. Movement of cartoned eggs into retail channels was fair to good. Supplies of larger sizes were close balance to tight, mediums were close balance to adequate. Prices for breaking stock in the Central States region trended higher. Trading and demand was moderate. Offerings were adequate. Buyers needing fill-in volumes paid higher price levels. Floor stocks were adequate. The undertone was steady to fully steady. Trading in light type fowl in the Southeast was too thin to report prices. Offerings for next week deliveries were at least sufficient for processing schedules. Demand was fair to good. The undertone was barely steady.

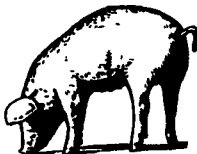
