Movement of ready-to-cook whole birds was sluggish. Seller offerings were fully adequate to ample and remained difficult to place. Live supplies were moderate. Weights were in a full range and mostly desirable. Processing schedules were very heavy. Less than trucklot asking prices were unchanged at 54 to 65 cents however, several sellers noted extra supplies as available for negotiation. Trade sentiment was barely steady to weak. In the parts complex, all items were at least adequate. Leg items and wings were in heaviest supply.
