JIBBAN PRICES LOWER, WEDNESDAY, WITH FAVORABLE GROWING CONDI-TIONS A MAJOR FACTOR. WHEAT 1 TO 2 CENTS LOWER EXCEPT MIN-NEAPOLIS SPRING WHEAT UP 40 CENTS. CORN UNCHANGED TO 2 CENTS LOWER. SORGHUM 2 TO 3 CENTS LOWER. SOY- BEANS 7 TO 10 CENTS LOWER. WHEAT PRICES FELL SLIGHTLY DUE PARTIALLY TO HARVEST PRESSURE. HARD RED WINTER WHEAT HARVEST LATE BUT TRYING TO FINISH UP AND SPRING WHEAT HARVEST, AL-READY UNDERWAY. 
