
Martin won that award by showing Bridon Just Leta, an animal in the 6-year-old and older class.




Dietrich won the grand champion shower and fitter title in the contest that drew about 30 4-H and FFA contestants from Cumberland and Franklin counties.

Her victory marked Dietrich's last opportunity to win because she will be too old to compete in the 4-H and FFA event at next year's fair.


