#### THREE MEN IN A BALLOON

hen Max Anderson, Ben Abruzzo, and Larry Newman landed at Miserey, France, on August 17, 1978, they were the first men to cross the Atlantic Ocean in a balloon. The 3,200-mile trip started at Presque Isle. Maine, and lasted 137 hours and 18 minutes. Although the Double Eagle II was



the first to successfully complete the trip. it was not the first to try. Captain Washington Harrison Donaldson, piloting the Daily Graphic with a two-man crew, had attempted to cross the Atlantic 105 years earlier. Donaldson left Brooklyn, New York, at 9:19 AM on October 6, 1873 but ran into a storm and the men baled out at 1.15 PM near New Canaan, Connecticut.


