More than 100 dairy-related young people between the ages of 10 and 16 have joined the 61 county dairy princesses and alternates to assist with the job of representing the industry.

Also presenting a workshop for the young male promoters was former Jefferson County Ambassador Dan McClelland of Minaka Farms, Reynoldsville. Special sessions on Animal Welfare were conducted for the adults and the young people by Dr. Mary Beth Bennett of Penn State University.

Following an introductory session in which each diary maid, ambassador, or junior representative had the opportunity to introduce him or herself, the group was divided into three sections. Each section rotated to three 50-minute workshops through the day.

The workshops centered around a variety of topics including -"The Basics-Cows, Products, Industry Facts and Nutrition"; "Speaking and Interviews-Fun not Fearsome" and "My Image-What to Wear, What to Do, and How to Do It." Concluding the program was a general session with skits and discussion by the leaders on the "how not to promote" as well as the "how to's."

A special session was also conducted for the adults by dairy princess coordinators Mim Kauffman and Mary Herman and program director Jan Harding to explain the functions of the Dairy Princess Program and the importance of the Dairymaid/Ambassador program in relation to it.
