Movement of ready-to-cook whole birds was slow to fair and typical of mid-week activity. Seller offerings were adequate to fully adequate and in close balance at some points on under 3 pound sizes. Live supplies were generally moderate. Weights varied but were mostly desirable. Processing schedules remained heavy. Less than trucklot asking prices were unchanged at 50 to 64 cents. Trade sentiment was about steady. In the parts complex, dark meat, particularly leg quarters were held with confidance. Machine cut wings were slow to clear, handcuts were in fairly good balance. Line run breasts were balanced with current needs. Some product was booked for late week delivery at lower prices but the market appears steady. Yellow skin leg quarters were short of trade needs and prices trended higher. Some buyer interest in bagged product went unfilled. Demand for machine cut wings slowed from early week but product cleared satisfactorily.

NATIONAL EGG MARKET - AT A GLANCE: Prices for the large sizes were unchanged to lower in the East and Midwest; otherwise, prices were unchanged. The trade sentiment ranged steady to weak, mostly barely steady to weak. Movement of cartoned eggs into retail channels was no better than fair. Supplies of larger sizes ranged adequate to ample, mediums were in fairly good balance. In the Central States prices for nest run breaking stock decreased sharply, checks and undergrades also trended lower. Light trading was reported for the ample offerings. Buyers continued very cautious due to next weekend holiday schedules. The undertone was weak. The trade sentiment was generally steady for light type hens in the Southeast. Demand was fair to good. Offerings were irregular but usually fully adequate for trade needs.

Eastern PA & NJ Poultry Report Atlanta, Ga.

Tuesday, August 24, 1993

Prices are about unchanged on light type but sales are too few to report on heavy hens. Offerings for next week's slaughter are at least adequate to fully adequate and most plant time has already been booked. Demand fair. Undertone generally steady.
