Cattle Evaluation Results

A beef cattle workshop held recently in Lancaster County attracted nearly 100 producers to the New Holland Sales Stables to participate in live animal evaluation. Two days later, 75 attended a carcass session at Stoltzfus Meats, Intercourse.

The program, conducted by Penn State extension, provided an opportunity for cattle feeders to estimate nine head of beef cattle for live weight, dressing percent, quality grade, yield grade, fat thickness, and rib eye area.

Participants compared their guesses with live estimates by four industry experts; ultrasound scans by Mike Cherchuck, Carlisle; and official carcass data collected by Dr. Bill Henning, Penn State extension meats specialist.

During both sessions, information was provided to producers regarding beef quality assurance, particularly injection site damage and how to prevent it.

Sponsors for the event included the Pennsylvania Beef Council, Hoechst-Roussel, Merck, Upjohn, and Franklin Labs.

Following is a table with official results, including the average estimates of four expert evaluators, ultrasound scans, and actual carcass data.

Numbers 420,935, no tag, 19E and 381 were crossbred steers. Numbers 20E and 919 were heifers. Numbers 1 and 57 were Holstein steers.

Guidelines For Cattle Evaluation:

Dressing % — Steer average - 62%, heifer average - 63% (higher if fat, clean, shrunk) (lower if thin, muddy, full)
Quality Grades — Prime, Choice, Select, Standard (highest to lowest ot "A" Maturity)
Yield Grades — 1 2 3 4 5 (1-leaner, 2 & 3-desirable finish, 4-fat, 5-very fat, wastey)
% Retail Cuts 54.6 52.3 50.0 47.7 45.4
Fat thickness — Range - .1" - 1.2" (desired - .3" - .5")
Rib Eye Area — Range - 9-16 sq. inches (a 700 lb. carcass should have 12.2 sq. inches of Rib Eye Area)
