OKLAHOMA NATIONAL STOCKYARDS WEEKLY CATTLE SUMMARY: Compared to last week: Trends not well established on post holiday reduced receipts. Few feeder steers and heifers firm. Steer and heifer calves steady. Demand moderate for yearlings, light for calves. Demand adversely affected by lack of load lot availability. Slaughter cows steady to firm. Slaughter bulls steady to \$1.00 lower. Moderate demand for 185 cows and bulls sold. Receipts this week 2,478; last week 10,565; last year 2,357. Supply consisted of 48 percent yearlings; 45 percent calves; and 7 percent cows and bulls. Prices follow with weighted average weight and price in parenthesis.

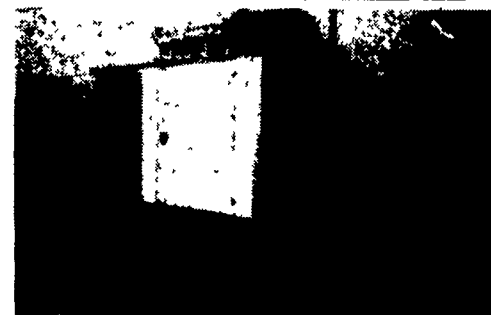
