 versity, will discuss "Effective Fly Control." Fly problems have been extremely difficult for producers this year. Pitts, former head of Penn State Entomology Department, is a leading U.S. entomologist.

On Thursday, September 30, Mike Brubaker Brubaker Agromonic Consulting Services, Inc., will discuss "Nutrient Management - It's The Law." Many agricultural states are under pressure to account for the proper management of fertilizers and manures (nutrients) because of possible contamination of ground and surface water. In Pennsylvania, a law has already been passed requiring farmers with more than 2,000 pounds of livestock or poultry per acre to operate with an approved nutrient management plan. Brubaker has been at the forefront of these issues and his firm is ranked the sixth largest agricultural consulting firm in the U.S.

Perret wrote the Command Performance Show for Bob Hope to appear before Queen Elizabeth II and traveled with Bob to many battlefields to entertain the troops.

Wednesday Conference

Following a complimentary buffet breakfast, Dr. Richard Reynnells, national program leader for poultry science, USDA Extension Services will open the conference with the presentation, "Animal Welfare - The Washington Scene." His responsibilities

include water quality, food safety, and the animal rights/welfare issues for USDA. Reynnells will pinpoint what poultry and egg producers can expect from the animal rights group in the immediate future.

Dr. Stephanie Doores, Penn State University Food Science Department, follows Reynnells with a discussion concerning "The Impact of Food Safety on Agriculture." Doores has been recognized for the Outstanding Young Women of America Award (Montgomery, Ala.), Pennsylvania Future Farmers of America Honorary Keystone Degree, and Gamma Sigma Delta Honorary Agriculture Society Excellence in Teaching Award.

Doores is expected to review the public pressure for safer food and how it might affect the food industry. The Wednesday morning conference concludes with keynote speaker, Charles

McDowell.

Thursday Conference

Thursday's conference also begins with a complimentary buffet breakfast followed by breakout sessions for broiler, egg, and turkey producers. At the Broiler Conference, Dr. Vergil Davis, director of avian biological development and regulatory affairs for Sanofi Animal Health, Inc., will review a new treatment for bursal disease. Following Davis, Noel Dykes, Sterwin Laboratories, Inc., will review ventilation options. Dykes is recognized as one of the authorities on various ventilation alternatives.

At the Egg Conference, Dr. Richard Gast, a microbiologist with USDA's Southeast Poultry Research Laboratory in Athens, Ga., will give an overview of all the research to-date in Salmonella enteritidis. For egg producers who have been plagued with this prob-

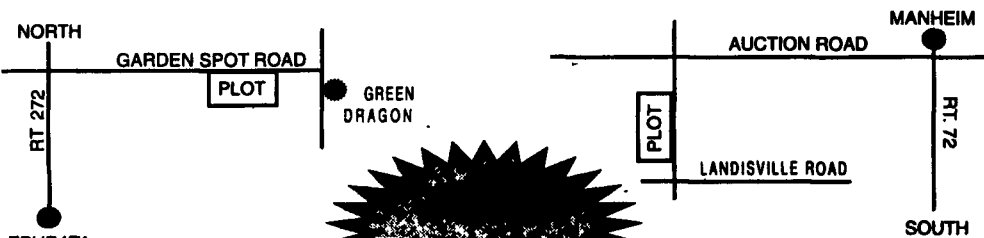

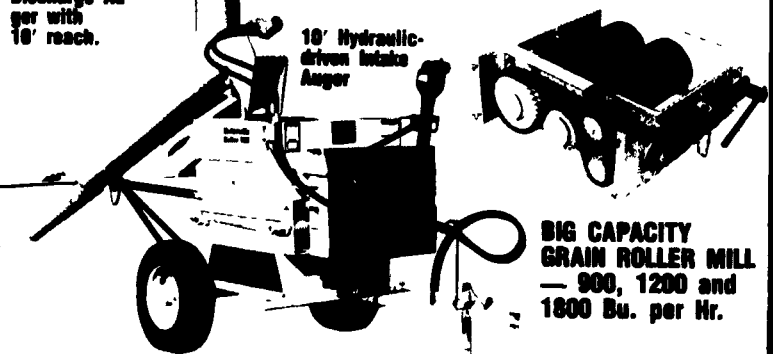
