

# Saddle Cinches 4-H Celebrates 25 Years With Reunion Horse Show

MANHEIM (Lancaster Co.) — Twenty-five years ago, a group of 10 teen-agers in the Manheim-Elizabethtown-Mount Joy area who had a love of horses got together to form a 4-H club. This year, the group, which numbers 60 youth, is celebrating a quarter of a century of active participation in the 4-H horse program by staging a 25-Year Reunion Horse Show on Saturday, Sept. 18, at Peter's Ring on Sunnyside Rd., Manheim.

The show will begin at 10 a.m. with classes for all past and present members, leaders, and families of 4-H Saddle Cinches. Classes range from the standard equitation and pleasure classes (English and Western) to the favorites of crawl thru the barrel and dollar bareback. There will be several championships and divisions, with walk trot jog classes for the youngsters and jumping and racing classes for the more experienced.

Classes will cost \$3 each and are open to anyone who has been associated with the club the past 25 years. Show organizer and leader Kendy Allen said she hopes past members will arrive for the show, even if they don't have a horse to ride, because the day is also planned as a reunion for former members to remember the good times.

Allen said this is the first step in the 25th anniversary celebration,

planned for November 20 at Ruhl's United Methodist Church, Elizabethtown Rd., with a covered dish supper starting at 6:30 p.m.

The club has been active in many areas of horsemanship and community service, and was recently recognized at the Lancaster County 4-H Achievement Night for its many community service activities, according to Allen.

# \$92,000 Sales In FFA, 4-H Auction

**NORVELT** (Westmoreland Co.) — At the Westmoreland County 4-H and FFA sale during the Westmoreland County Fair, some bidders got bargains, according to John Bidrower, Derry area High School ag teacher.

The champion market steer, owned by Amanda Buttermore, Mt. Pleasant, sold for \$2.60/pound, about half the price of last year's champion.

The family of this year's champion is known more for its dairy involvements, rather than beef. Mother of the winner, Wilma Buttermore, said she had shown for 10 years as a youngster. The family purchased steers from two places for their children to show this year. Amanda's brother, James, showed the champion medium weight steer.

Amanda showed the grand champion in the Westmoreland 4-H and FFA Dairy Show.

"The grand champion didn't bring a good price, when compared to other fairs," said Wilma. "But no one in our family ever won the grand before."

Overall sales totaled \$92,774.90 for 247 animals and dressed carcasses.

A follow-up appreciation dinner for buyers and exhibitors was scheduled for the Derry Area High School on September 16.

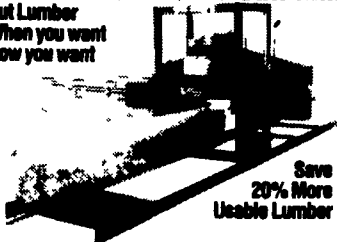
