NATIONAL EGG MARKET - AT A GLANCE: Prices trended unchanged to lower on mediums in the Northeast; generally unchanged on the larger sizes and elsewhere around the country. The trade sentiment ranged steady to weak, mostly steady to cautiously steady. Movement of carton eggs into retail channels was light to good, mostly fair to fairly good. Supplies of jumbos were in close balance, extra large mostly adequate, large adequate to ample, and mediums adequate to burdensome. In the Central States prices for breaking stock were unchanged. Trading and demand was fair. Offerings were adequate. Most breakers operated fulltime on regular commitments. Floor stocks were adequate. The undertone was generally steady. In the Southeast, trading in light type hens was too thin to report prices today. Demand was moderate but unaggressive for at least sufficient offerings. The undertone was about steady to steady.
