WOODCHUCKS HIBERNATE NOW.

AMERICA'S FIRST LOAN

September 18 marks the 204th anniversary of the U.S. government's first loan Alexander Hamilton, who was appointed secretary of the new Treasury Department on September 2, 1789, wasted no time in negotiating with the Bank of New York and the Bank of North America. Hamilton obtained a total of \$191,608.81, and used it to cover the salaries of the president, senators, representatives, and officers of the first Congress. But this was not the beginning of our national debt, for this loan, known as the Temporary Loan of 1789, was completely paid off by June 8, 1790.

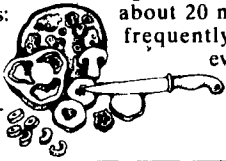
Ripen green tomatoes in a brown paper bag in a dark place. Remember to check them regularly.

HASHED SQUASH

- 3 slices bacon, diced
- 1 large onion, sliced thin
- 1 large or 2 small zucchinis, cut into 1-inch dice
- 2 cups chopped tomatoes
- 1 green pepper, chopped
- 1/4 teaspoon oregano
- 1/4 teaspoon basil
- salt and pepper

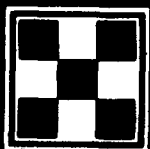

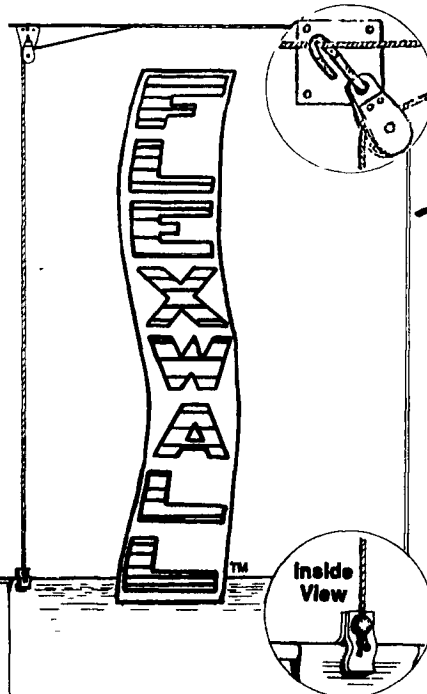
