Prices in all reporting areas were unchanged. The trade sentiment ranged steady to fully steady and generally improved over early week. Movement of cartoned eggs into retail channels was fair to good, with the best demand where retail features were in progress or planned. Supplies of larger sizes were in close balance to adequate; mediums were adequate to available. In the Central States, prices for nest run breaking stocks trended higher, checks and undergrades were unchanged. Trading and demand was spotty. Offerings were adequate. Supplies were adequate. Available product was held with confidence while buyers bid higher for fill-in needs. The undertone was at least steady. In the South Central States, trading in light type hens was too thin to report prices. Demand was fair. Most plants had sufficient hens from contractual volumes to fill needs. 
