DAILY NATIONAL GRAIN SUMMARY GRAIN AND SOYBEAN PRICES CLIMBED HIGHER, WEDNESDAY, SUPPORTED BY IMPROVED EXPORT SALES AND SCATTERED FREEZE IN WESTERN CORNBELT AREAS LAST NIGHT. WHEAT 1 TO 4 CENTS HIGHER. CORN 1 TO 2 CENTS HIGHER. SOYBEANS 2 TO 6 CENTS HIGHER. SPRING WHEAT HARVEST DELAYS CONTINUE TO PUSH PRICES HIGHER AND CROP QUALITY REMAINS IN QUESTION. EXPORT DEMAND INCREASED WITH SEVERAL GOOD PURCHASES ON THE BOOKS. CORN AND BEAN CROPS WERE HIT WITH SCATTERED FROST IN CORNBELT AREAS LAST NIGHT AND SOME DAMAGE IS POSSIBLE. CORN HARVEST IS JUST UNDERWAY IN SOUTHERN CORNBELT AREAS BUT NO YIELD REPORTS HAVE BEEN RELEASED AS YET. EXPORT INTEREST PICKED UP THE PAST COUPLE OF DAYS, ESPECIALLY FOR CORN TO RUSSIA.

OKLAHOMA NATIONAL STOCKYARDS WEEKLY CATTLE SUMMARY: Compared to last week: English and exotic feeder steers over 650 lbs. steady to \$1.00 higher. Feeder heifers over 650 lbs. steady. Steer and heifer calves under 650 lbs., as well as Brahma Crosses of all weights steady to \$2.00 lower, with greatest declines on Brahma crosses. Demand moderate for all classes. Most Brahma Cross feeders now under heavy discounts as is typical for this time of year. Feedlots north of here totally out of the Brahma cross market. Quality of yearlings plain with extremely large supply of Brahma crossbreds. Calf quality average, however majority are unweaned. Weigh-ups average to full but overall not as bad as two weeks ago. Yearling flesh condition slightly thin thru moderately fleshy. Up to 6 inches of rain received Monday in central and eastern Oklahoma. Slaughter cows \$1.00 higher; slaughter bulls \$1.00 lower. Receipts this week 11,750; last week's holiday period 2,478; last year 11,552. Supply consisted of 55 percent yearlings and calves over 600 lbs.; 40 percent calves under 600 lbs.; and 5 percent cows and bulls. Prices follow with weighted average weight and price in parenthesis.
