The reserve grand champion heifer and the champion cow-calf pair were also bred and owned entries. Judges for this event were lead judge Tom Hook, a Tracy, Minn., cattle breeder, and associate judge Jeff Bedwell, instructor and livestock judging coach at Northeast Oklahoma A&M College, Miami, Okla.


For their grand champion female, Hook and Bedwell selected Division IV winner RJY Sara 9208, a March yearling sired by HPH Raceways Dasher 34Z. The heifer was bred by RJY Polled Herefords, Edgar, Neb., and owned by 14-year-old Steven Soules, Skiatook, Okla.

The reserve grand champion heifer was also champion of the bred-and-owned show and the Division III champion. She was TJ 030 Jaqui 239, a May 1992 TJ-Jaguar 030 daughter bred and owned by 21-year-old Kent Tjardes, Gibson City, III. The reserve champion bred-and-owned heifer was HPH Infinity 37B, a November '92 daughter of Kilmrle Deliverance 80U. She came out of Division I and was bred and owned by 17-year-old Heather Hicks, Cullman, Ala.

The champion cow-calf pair, also a bred-and-owned entry, was exhibited by 15-year-old Curt Stockdale, Dayton, Pa. He won with CS Miss 1st Flag 21A, a 2-year-old GS Checkered Flag daughter, and her April heifer calf by Beau Donald Rival.


