In the 4-H Sheep Breeding Show, Jennifer Rickert exhibited the champion and reserve champion Hampshire ewes. The champion Suffolk ewe was shown by Thomas Ebert.

In the market lamb show, 41 lambs were paraded before judge Chris Herr. Garnering grand champion honors was Earl Marshall with his 119-pound Suffolk lamb. Reserve grand champion honors went to Andrew Korb with a 118-pound Dorset.

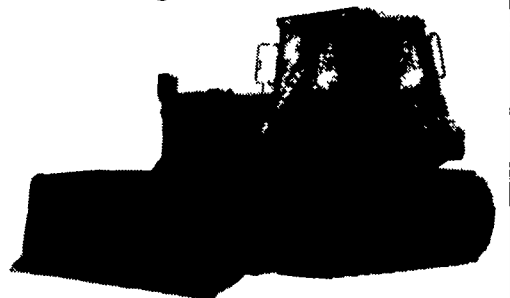
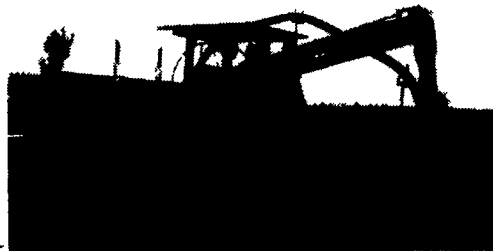
