USDA DAILY NATIONAL GRAIN SUMMARY BOOMING EXPORT ACTIVITY AND UNFAVORABLE WEATHER FAILED TO BOOST CORN AND SOYBEAN PRICES, BUT WHEAT A LITTLE HIGHER. WHEAT STEADY TO FIVE CENTS HIGHER. CORN ONE TO TWO CENTS LOWER. SORGHUM THREE TO FOUR CENTS LOWER. SOYBEANS EIGHT TO TEN CENTS LOWER, WITH SOME ILLINOIS PROCESSORS BACKING BIDS UP 18 CENTS. A LONG LIST OF EXPORT ACTIVITY ON THE WIRE TUESDAY. MANY BIDS, OFFERS, TENDERS, CREDIT AGREEMENTS, PL-480, AND GSM-102 PROGRAM ANNOUNCEMENTS WERE IN THE NEWS. SOME SUBSTANTIAL ORDERS, INCLUDING WHEAT TO EGYPT AND SOYBEAN MEAL FOR RUSSIA. SUBSTANTIAL AMOUNT OF CORN TRADED TO GO OUT OF THE COUNTRY LAST WEEK AND THE EARLY PART OF THIS WEEK. WEATHER CONTINUES TO BE NASTY MANY PLACES. CROPS LATE MATURING AND FALL HARVEST ALREADY WELL BEHIND USUAL AND RAINS CONTINUE TO SPREAD OUT ACROSS MUCH OF THE NATION. WHEAT HARVEST NOT COMPLETED IN THE DAKOTAS AND NORTHWEST, WITH CORN HARVEST VERY LATE IN THE SOUTHEAST AND MIDWEST. THIS FALL STARTING OUT MUCH LIKE LAST YEAR.

EXPORT NEWS: U.S.D.A. ACCEPTED A BID TO SELL 25,000 TONNES OF WHEAT FLOUR TO YEMEN UNDER THE EXPORT ENHANCEMENT PROGRAM; SHIPMENT SCHEDULED FOR DEC/JAN. U.S.D.A. ACCEPTED A BID TO SELL 5,000 TONNES OF HARD RED WINTER WHEAT TO FINLAND, UNDER THE B.E.P. FOR OCTOBER SHIPMENT. U.S.D.A. ACCEPTED A BID TO SELL 13 TONNES OF BUTTEROIL/ANHYDROUS MILKFAT TO LEBANON, UNDER THE DAIRY EXPORT INCENTIVE PROGRAM, SHIPMENT SCHEDULED FOR OCT/DEC.
