

The New Jersey inventory was 21 percent below last Monday's level and the New York inventory was 10 percent above last week.

Thighs were short of trade needs. Legs and drumsticks were adequate but slow to clear. Leg quarters were fully adequate to ample. Prices trended lower. Wings were readily available, trading was at competitive prices.




