Trading was limited to standing commitments. Thighs were short of trade needs. Legs and drumsticks were adequate but slow to clear. Leg quarters were fully adequate to ample. Prices trended lower. Wings were readily available, trading was at competitive prices.

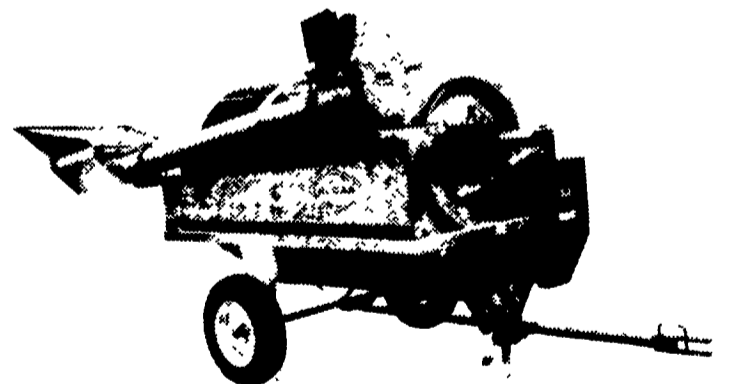
