

# Bedford County Farm Wins Big At National Guernsey Show

**HARRISBURG** (Dauphin Co.) — Snider Homestead Farm, owned by Berneta Gable, New Enterprise, took home an armful of banners, trophies and ribbons from the National Guernsey Show held last week in Harrisburg in conjunction with the Pa. All American Dairy Show.

The All-American Dairy Show is one of the nation's top dairy competitions. Over 2,500 entries are vying for \$78,000 in prize money and the prestigious titles of All-American champions.

The show is sponsored annually by the Pennsylvania Dairy and Allied Industries Association in cooperation with the Pennsylvania Department of Agriculture and Farm Products Show Commission.

Gable's 3-year-old, "Sniders Telearstar Heaven," was selected the grand champion female, the best senior female bred and owned by the exhibitor, and winner in the Pennsylvania 3-year-old Guernsey futurity.

Snider Homestead Farm also emerged as the premier breeder and premier exhibitor of the show, and winner in the classes for best three females and exhibitor's herd.

Picking up honors for the junior champion female was the Anderson family of Kennedy, New York, with "Sher-Beck Bionic Sally."

Charles Luchsinger of Syracuse, New York, was the official judge.

## Judges Name 4-Year-Old Holstein All American Supreme

 Hanover-Hill Inspiration and her dam is Allanvale Puget Anetia, a Sheik daughter scored VG.

In her 3-year-old record of 305 days, Tina milked 24,144 pounds milk, 4.3 percent and 1,030 pounds fat and 3.4 percent and 806 pounds protein.

"I sent my father to look at her in Ohio, and bought her without seeing her," said owner Ernie Kueffner. "She calved in May with a heifer, after having twin heifers last year for her previous owner. We showed her 18 days after calving; she was champion and best uddered of our North Carolina state show. I like stylish cows, and she's a wonderful cow to work with."

Tina won best udder honors last year in her class at the Madison, Wisconsin, show. Exhibited again at the Royal Winter Fair in Toronto, Canada, she was first and best-uddered 3-year-old, and selected best udder and reserve of the Royal's intermediate-age-cow championship. Among Tina's honors are awards as All-Canadian junior 3-year-old and reserve All-

American junior 3-year-old.

Reserve supreme champion was the Jersey champion, "Pensmith TJ Missy Mindy," exhibited by Wayne and Alan Stiles and Billy and Mike Heath, Spring Valley Farm, Westminster, Maryland. Mindy also won her breed title earlier Thursday, in the Jersey show judged by Robert Fitzsimmons, Montpelier, Vermont.

The 4-year-old Jersey is scored Excellent. She is sired by Duncan Saint John, and her dam is Pensmith Magician Mindy. In her 3-year-old, 365-day lactation, Mindy finished with 15,510 pounds of milk; 4.4 percent, or 682 pounds of fat; and 3.6 percent, or 565 pounds, of protein.

She was recently named the supreme dairy winner at the Maryland State Fair and was first 3-year-old and honorable mention grand champion at the 1992 National Jersey Show.

Selection of the Harrisburg All-American supreme winner was made by secret ballot of a panel of three judges. They were Ginger Myers, Littlestown, Guernsey breeder and former Guernsey

breed association field representative; Jeff Harding, manager of GEN Farms, Kennedyville, Maryland, and former sales manager for the Pennsylvania Holstein Association; and Paul Miller, Linglestown, a classifier for the National Holstein Association and a Holstein breeder.

Sharing in the supreme contest pageantry finals were champions of the Ayrshire, Brown Swiss, Guernsey and Milking Shorthorn breed shows, held earlier in the week.

The Ayrshire champion was "Covey Farms CVR Rosetta," a 4-year-old owned by Palmyra Farms, Hagerstown, Md., and bred by Brandon Covey, Oklahoma. Scored EX-90, Rosetta's current lactation, at 335 days, is at 26,070 pounds of milk, with 4.2 percent or 1,103 pounds butterfat, and 3.5 percent, or 912 pounds protein.

Her sire is Covey Farms HC Rosabelle and her dam is Covey Farms Vitality Reliable. She was first and production winner in her class at the 1992 Southern National Ayrshire Show and grand

champion of the 1992 Junior Southern National Ayrshire show.

Topping the Brown Swiss breed show was 4-year-old "Hawthorne Rhythmic Riki," owned by Charles Lee Chaney, Gartstlyn Brown Swiss, New Windsor, Md. Her breeder is Kathy Griesheimer, Valley City, Ohio.

She is scored Excellent and sired by Hawthorne Eritia Raybette, and out of dam Forest Lawn TJ Rhythm. Her 3-year, 365-day lactation record is at 27,180 pounds milk, with 4 percent and 1,099 pounds butterfat and 3.7 percent and 1,008 pounds protein. Earlier this year, she was named grand champion of the Canton, Ohio, Brown Swiss show and took first place in her class at the Maryland State Fair.

Bedford Countians Brad and Berneta Gable and family exhibited the champion Guernsey, "Snider's Telearstar Heaven." The Very Good-89 senior 3-year-old is bred and owned by their Snider's Homestead Farm at New Enterprise.

With 174 days credit in her three-year lactation, the Guernsey,

champion is producing 10,808 pounds of milk, with 4.1 percent and 441 pounds fat and 3.3 percent and 359 pounds protein. Her dam, Snider's Big Tex Hugie, has lifetime records of 103,826 milk, 4,678 fat and 3,785 protein.

"Spring Meadows Greeting" took top Milking Shorthorn breed honors for owner-breeders Mike and Polly Ullom and family, Spring Meadows Farm, Centerburg, Ohio. Classified Very Good-88, she is sired by Krause's Maxine's Mike and her dam is Spring Meadows Jet Star, VG-87.

A 5-year-old, she has a current 305-day lactation record of 18,070 pounds of milk, with 3.4 percent or 630 pounds fat, and 3.4 percent or 6.39 pounds protein. She was part of the winning dam-daughter entry at last week's All-American, and took reserve champion breed honors at both the 1991 and 1992 All-American shows.

Some 2,000 head of the nation's top cattle were exhibited in the 30th annual Pennsylvania All-American Dairy Show events, which included the state junior dairy show on Sept. 20.
