The junior champion female, "Hillpine Jed Carla," was exhibited by Ron Heffner and Marion Andrew of Jefferson, Maryland. Deanna Sparling of Troy, Pennsylvania, exhibited the reserve junior champion female and best junior female bred and owned by the exhibitor, "Maple Flat Acres Rosie."

Pamtom Farm was named the premier exhibitor of the show, while their premier breeder award went to Penn Gate Farm of Littlestown, Pennsylvania. The premier sire was "Hanover Hill Starbuck."






Mexican Mission
