Matthew Howard had the junior champion Holstein with a senior yearling and George Bard had the reserve junior champion with an intermediate calf.

Lampeter Livestock Sale

Held Last Friday Night

LAMPETER (Lancaster Co.)—A little benevolent activity was part of the 4-H lamb sale at the Lampeter Fair livestock sale last Friday evening.

After Lisa Reiff sold her champion 4-H market lamb to three buyers for \$6 per pound, it was announced that Lisa was donating the proceeds of the 126-pound lamb (\$756) to her brother who is on a mission project in New Zealand.

The buyers, Black Bear Structures, R & R Landscaping, and Lancaster Ford Tractor, then announced they were giving the lamb back to be resold to benefit the 4-H Development fund. Walter M. Dunlap & Sons then bought the lamb for \$1.90 per pound.

The champion FFA market lamb shown by Kyle Harnish sold to Keystone Farm Credit for \$4 per pound.

In the steer sale, Dale Livengood sold his champion 4-H market steer to H. C. Reineer and Son for \$3.45 per pound, and Jay Hess sold the champion FFA market steer for \$2.10 per pound to Darrenkamp's Markets.

Crystal Charles sold her 4-H champion market hog to Leidys Inc., for \$3.10 per pound and Jay Hess sold his champion FFA market hog to Witmer's IGA for \$3.05 per pound.

Other market hog champions were sold as follows: Jason Reifsnnyder, champion middle weight, \$1.45 per pound to Hess Butchers; Matt Fry, champion lightweight, \$1.40 per pound to Powls; Keith Fry, champion light heavyweight, \$1.35 per pound to Thomas Truck-
